the church to do so.

And upon being made aware that the parties petitioned the church, through the bishop and the other parties, to bring resolution, and this matter was presented to the assembly and there was a vote and there was an order entered addressing all of the issues that are before the court. So I do not believe that I have jurisdiction at this point in time. The church has made their decision that they have jurisdiction to address all of these issues, that this is not a property matter, this is a matter within the jurisdiction, in control of the church.

issue of the deeds to the properties, but that has changed since that was first argued in front of me. And as I said to you, the church has done what's convenient for them, and they have wanted the church to have control at certain points in time, and they've wanted the court to. And I feel like it has, in a lot of ways, been disingenuous on how it's been handled. And so I understand the motions that are before me today, but based on all of the information provided to me and what's in the court file, I do not believe this, this court has jurisdiction any further.
